The image above shows an excavator removing the last bit of rock from the future North parking lot. So far we have blasted and removed roughly 18,000 cubic yards of rock from the site! That is enough to fill 5 ½ Olympic swimming pools.



The over excavation has started to be backfilled this week. After we reached native soil, we started to backfilled with sand from the east side of the site.
